Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504) and The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, helps to ensure anti-discrimination is enforced throughout the work undertaken by all recipients of federal funding. Title VI provisions include, but are not limited to, prohibiting discrimination on the grounds of race, color, sex, age, national origin, religion, disabling condition, or being included within minority populations and/or low-income populations. It also prohibits exclusion from participation, denial of benefits to, or others subject to discrimination under any program or activity administered by the County.

If you believe that you have been subjected to discrimination based upon disabling medical condition, you may file a complaint with the County's General Services Office.
