III. 10:20 Applicant Interviews - Each committee member reviewed applications through the ZoomGrants electronic grants management system. There are 3 components to the application review process: 1) Applications in ZoomGrants and how they fit federal and local criteria and priorities; 2) Applicant interviews and, 3) Committee discussions and deliberations. Committee members worked hard to balance the recommendations Countywide and among diverse needs.

The following recommendations for federal grant funding will go directly to the Board of Supervisors and do not go before the full Commission. Applicants for federal Emergency Solutions (ESG) were received first followed by applicants for the federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. There were 12 applications (8 applicants) for the ESG funding. There were 21 applications for CDBG (19 applicants). HCD staff provided a staff report to guide the Committee members. Federal funding amounts are preliminary.
