Introduction

PC 1000 - Drug Diversion is a deferred entry of judgment program for nonviolent drug offenders. The defendant is placed on court probation and referred to Substance Abuse treatment. The PC1000 Diversion "diverts" those accused of drug charges in California away from the traditional criminal court system into a SUD Tx program if eligible. Charges are dismissed upon completion.

Goals

- ✓ Work with each participant to successfully address his or her alcohol or drug-related problems and to eliminate chemical dependency to alcohol or drugs.
- ✓ Maintain the health and safety of the public.



Objectives

- ✓ Provide education to all participants consisting of factual, current and accurate information about chemical dependency and the effects of alcohol and other drugs on the individual, the family and the community.
- ✓ Offer encouragement and support to all participants in evaluating, understanding and accepting responsibility for one's decision about the continued use or abuse of alcohol and drugs.
- ✓ Provide health-nurturing models that contribute to each participant making appropriate and permanent healthy lifestyle changes.



Program Requirements

The PC 1000 Drug Diversion Program lasts a minimum of four months. A minimum of 30 hours of treatment will be provided. Participation will consist of individual and group counseling sessions.

Program services will also include, but are not limited to, educational sessions about drug abuse, HIV infection and AIDS and tuberculosis as related to substance abuse. Involvement in a traditional self-help program is also required.

Each participant will:

1. Attend ten (10) hours of individual counseling. Each session will not last longer than one (1) hour.
2. Attend ten (10) hours of group counseling, Each session will not last longer than two (2) hours.
3. Attend five (5) hours of relapse prevention sessions. Each session will not last longer than two (2) hours.
4. Attend a minimum of ten (10) meetings in a self-help program during the course of participation in PC 1000.
