

Alcohol & Drug Programs (ADP)

In FY 2017/18, **3,267 unique clients** admitted to programs were open to ADP: 89% adults and 11% youth.

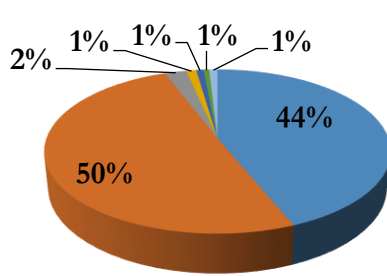

Over half (54%) of all ADP clients served were Hispanic and 41% were White. Among both adults and youth, just under two-thirds of ADP clients were male. Whereas among adult ADP clients ethnicity was more equally divided between Whites (44%) and Hispanics (50%), this was not the case among ADP youth: 83% were Hispanic and 13% were White. The adult and youth ADP system of care served proportionally dissimilar ethnic populations.

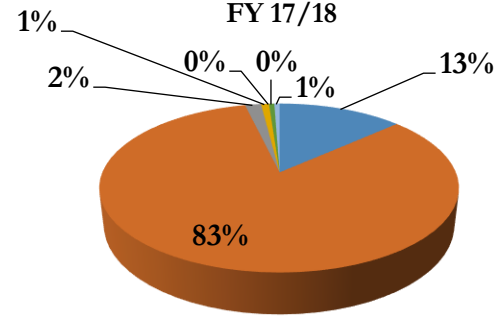


**ADP ADULT Ethnicity
