It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Adopt the Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara as the Successor Agency to the former County of Santa Barbara Redevelopment Agency, entitled In The Matter Of Adopting The Budget For Fiscal Year 2016-17 For The County Of Santa Barbara As Successor Agency To The Former County of Santa Barbara Redevelopment Agency.
- b) Find that the proposed actions are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15378(b)(4) and 15378(b)(5) of the CEQA Guidelines, because they are government fiscal, organizational, or administrative activities that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.

Summary Text:

As modified by the California Supreme Court, the ABX 1 26 amendments to California Redevelopment Law dissolved all redevelopment agencies in California on February 1, 2012. By taking no "opt out" action under California Health and Safety Code Section 34173 (d) (1), the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara decided that the County of Santa Barbara would become the "Successor Agency" to the former County of Santa Barbara Redevelopment Agency.
