

# PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to Elections Code Section 9509 the attached materials for the November 3, 2020 General Election, **Measure L-2020 (Bond Measure)** for the Cold Spring Elementary School District are hereby submitted for 10-day public examination from July 31, 2020 through August 10, 2020. During the 10-day examination period provided by this section, any voter of the jurisdiction in which the election is being held may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The writ of mandate or injunction request shall be filed no later than the end of the 10-calendar-day public examination period. A peremptory writ of mandate or an injunction shall be issued only upon clear and convincing proof that the material in question is false, misleading, or inconsistent with the requirements of the Elections Code, and that issuance of the writ or injunction will not substantially interfere with the printing or distribution of the official election materials as provided by law.
