

4 GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF
5 AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR
6 OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

7 Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the March
8 18th and 27th, 2020 Orders (“Order”) of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the
9 Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the March 17th, March 26th, and April 16th,
10 2020 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of Santa Barbara County
11 (“Court”), this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

- 12 1. All previous orders of the Court remain in full force and effect.
- 13 2. Any judge may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code
14 for the holding of a preliminary examination and the defendant’s right to release from 10 court
15 days to not more than 30 court days;
- 16 3. Any judge may extend the time period provided in section 825 of the Penal Code
17 within which a defendant charged with a felony offense must be taken before a magistrate from
18 48 hours to not more than seven days;
- 19 4. Non-custody criminal cases which have not received a new notice of hearing,
20 currently scheduled on the Court’s calendar will be re-scheduled and a new notice of hearing will
21 be sent to the parties.

22 THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
